We have been sending boxes from St. Mary's for quite a few years and have reached and blessed many children in 9 different countries some countries more than once. A child receives an OCC box once in a lifetime. That's why we try hard to make them special.

By packing these boxes, we are seeking to act on St. Mary's mission to fulfill the great commission of spreading the good news of Jesus and the hope that he brings to the world.

The boxes are now available in the Parish Hall every week up to Sunday, November 13th. Please have them filled by then because we will have "the Blessing of the Boxes" that day. I will deliver them to the drop off center the following week.

So, please consider taking one or more boxes home to fill with the suggested items on the flyer given out in Church. There is also an information leaflet in every box. No check or cash is needed for the suggested \$10 donation. It will be fully covered by St. Mary's from the profits from the Fall Spaghetti Dinner. PTL. So, just find wonderful items to fill your box with – please remember to fill out and paste to your box the gender and age label that is in every box.

The children will receive books in their own language along with their box and during the 12-lesson course they can attend.

Traditionally, the age group that receives the fewest boxes are 10-14 year old's. Boys traditionally get fewer boxes than the girls.

Have fun and enjoy packing your box. Look for mark downs at this end of season time. Remember to check the donor lists and remove the packing materials because remote destinations do not have trash facilities.


### The summary of this New Testament Bible Study by Lifeway is as follows:
