"Blessings of the Boxes" is on Sunday, November 13th!!! Please have you filled box returned by then. Thank you for being part of this annual activity at St Mary's which fulfills Matthew 28:18-20 where Jesus says, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations".

We are grateful to St Mary's and the "Spaghetti dinner team" for raising the \$10 donation to accompany every box. This will help provide the Greatest Story Books, the message of hope Jesus brings, that every child receives in their own language along with the gift box.

Our boxes will go via a packing station at a church in Glens Falls to Baltimore where they will be inspected, packed into shipping cartons and containers, and sent off to their destination!!

Each of our boxes will have a tracking label on them and we will be notified as to which country they go to.

Last year in 2021, in the USA more than 9 million boxes were collected. Together with boxes from Canada, The United Kingdom, Australia, and others more than 10.5 million boxes reached children in over 170 countries. The number is expected to be more this year.

So, thank you for being a missionary by sending a gift box to a child in a faraway land, who's whole family can be impacted by hearing about Jesus and God's love for us all. \bigcirc


