The Bazaar proceeds totaled \$1977, and the pie sale totaled \$507.

We wish to express our gratitude to all who participated in these projects in any way, generously contributing your time, talents, and treasure. The deepened connections with each other and with our community are priceless. A special thanks also to everyone who helped make the reception in honor of Colonel Williams such a beautiful tribute to him and the entire Williams family.







SMC Studies, and Services

And any other items you feel lead to donate will always be a blessing to those in our community less fortunate than ourselves.


