Also, the St. Kateri Shrine is on route 5 just west of Johnstown. All are about an hour drive from here. Pow Wows are not just for fun and to sell hand made things. They are very spiritual ceremonies which

starts promptly at noon. Dances are not for entertainment but each one has a meaning to the Native culture.

ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

THERE IS A STATUE OF SAINT KATERI IN THE BACK OF OUR CHURCH

SHE WAS BORN ON THE BANK OF THE MOHAWK RIVER WHERE THE MARTYR'S SHRINE NOW IS. THAT IS JUST EAST OF AURIESVILLE. WHEN SHE WAS FOUR MOST OF HER TRIBE WAS WIPED OUT BY SMALLPOX. THOSE THAT SURVIVED MOVED ACROSS THE RIVER TO 3 MILES WEST OF WHAT IS NOW JOHNSTOWN.

WHEN SHE WAS A YOUNG TEEN, SHE LISTENED VERY INTENTLY TO A JESUIT MISSIONARY AND BECAME A BELIEVER IN JESUS. SHE SPREAD THE WORD THROUGHOUT THE MOHAWK NATION. HER CATHOLIC NAME BECAME CATHERINE AND SHE WAS ALSO CALLED THE LILY OF THE MOHAWKS.

WHEN SHE WAS AROUND 18 HER TRIBE WAS FORCED TO MOVE TO WHAT IS NOW THE AKWESASNE RESERVATION ON THE BANK OF THE ST. LAWRENCE RIVER. SHE WAS NOMINATED FOR SAINTHOOD BY POPE JOHN PAUL THE 2ND AND WAS CANONIZED BY POPE BENEDICT IN 2012.

KATERI PASSED ON TO A BETTER PLACE AT THE YOUNG AGE OF 34.

SHE WAS FROM THE IROQUOIS CONFEDERACY, MOHAWK NATION, ALGONQUIN TRIBE AND TURTLE CLAN. THE IROQUOIS ARE MADE UP OF OVER 50 TRIBES JUST LIKE THE STATES ARE OF AMERICA.

MANY OF US IN THIS TOWN, AREA AND CHURCH HAVE DISTANT ANCESTORS FROM THE IROQUOIS. BISHOP WILLIAM, WHEN HE WAS HERE A COUPLE YEARS AGO SAW THE STATUE AND WANTED TO KNOW ALL ABOUT HER.
